

Monthly Board Update to Staff  
February 2018

The Recreation Board met February 12th at 5:30 p.m. before the regularly scheduled board meeting.

Misty Gallegos presented the financial report and the current district enrollment numbers. As of the first of the month, district enrollment was 1033 students. You can find the full enrollment and financial report on BoardDocs.

Misty Gallegos presented two options we have for moving forward on a contract for food services for the district. The options included amending and renewing the contract with Chartwells or issuing a RFP. The Board approved administration to begin the process of amending and renewing the contract with Chartwells for the 2018-2019 school year.

Superintendent Abrams presented the proposed School calendar for the 2018-2019 school year to the board. The School Board reviewed and approved the calendar as presented. The calendar may be accessed and found on Board Docs.

Superintendent Jon Abrams presented the board with a request to add Entrepreneurship and Music Theory & Technology as courses to be offered the beginning of the 2018-2019 school year. This request was approved by the Board.

New hires approved by the Board included: Samantha Logan as a sub custodian; Carly Eastman for the para pool; Richard Crozier and Michael Sandberg as sub-bus drivers.

Kim Nelson gave the facility report on February 7, 2018, at the COW meeting. The monthly facility report can be found in BoardDocs.

Two teachers from Carpenter Elementary School, Amber Imel and Chelsie Bruckner, proposed and presented a Kinder Boost Program to the board at the COW meeting. A survey to collect district data will be presented to the board via email and sent to families to see if participation numbers and community interest is high enough to proceed with starting a Kinder Boot program in our district.

Superintendent Jon Abrams informed the board that the CCC is recommending that we consider a grade weighing policy similar to the new Hathaway grade weighing policy for GPA, which is a five point scale. Approved college courses are worth five points as opposed to four. The memo from the State can be found in BoardDocs if you would like to review it.

A concern has been expressed regarding how to provide our student athletes with a positive experience when the numbers exceed what a coach can reasonably manage. Athletic Director's were told that if cuts are necessary they would be supported by the Board.

Misty Gallegos presented the Board with the results of three audits that were performed by the State.

The Joint Powers Board members and terms were discussed.

The 2018 WSBA Legislative Forum and Reception is Sunday, February 25 at the Cheyenne Little America.

The Wyoming Superintendent Summit will be February 26-28th in Cheyenne WY.

It was discussed whether or not students and children should be allowed on the court during intermissions and half time of games. Safety and legal liability were the two main concerns. From this point forward children and students that are not on a team that is playing will not be allowed on the court. If you have kids, please help us to keep them off of the court.
